



UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT "2+4" PROGRAMME AGREEMENT

Between

COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE, CHINA AGRICULTURAL UNIVERSITY

and

THE ROYAL (DICK) SCHOOL OF VETERINARY STUDIES, THE UNIVERSITY OF EDINBURGH

This agreement creates a cooperative transfer program between the College of Veterinary Medicine, China Agricultural University (CVM, CAU) and the Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies, the University of Edinburgh (R(D)SVS). This agreement is designed for students enrolled at CVM, CAU to pursue transfer admission to R(D)SVS to earn the University of Edinburgh's Bachelor of Veterinary Medicine and Surgery (BVM&S) degree.

Admission to R(D)SVS will follow the standard R(D)SVS application and admission procedures for transfer students, including an endorsement of the student by CAU. Final decision for admission of CAU transfer students is made by R(D)SVS.

Each year, up to 5 students will be admitted into R(D)SVS. Applicants to the BVM&S degree will be reviewed and considered by R(D)SVS on a case by case basis.

Undergraduate students at CVM, CAU should fulfill all of the following requirements for transfer admission:

- Complete the first two years study at CVM, CAU
- Obtain a GPA of 3.4 (4 point scale) or higher
- Recommended by Student Management Office of CVM, CAU
- Study full time in CVM, CAU prior to transfer
- Obtain a minimum score of 7.0 on the IELTS exam before admission.
- Attend an interview

Students from CVM, CAU who are granted transfer admission to R(D)SVS, will directly enter the 4 year Graduate Entry Programme (GEP) at R(D)SVS to complete the BVM&S degree.

The annual tuition fee for the BVM&S degree is fixed for the full duration of the course. Tuition fees and related charges are due in full in advance or at the start of each academic year.

Upon successful completion of the academic program at R(D)SVS, the student will be awarded the CAU's bachelor degree.

This transfer cooperative agreement will be instituted for a five-year period, with renewal upon favorable evaluations by both institutions.
